

boundary of the said section seven; thence southerly along the said west boundary a distance of two hundred and fifty feet, to the southwest corner of the northwest quarter of the said section seven; thence westerly a distance of ninety-nine feet to the iron post and mound marking the southeast corner of the northeast quarter of section twelve in the said township one range sixteen east of the principal meridian, as the said monument is shown upon a plan of survey of the said township approved and confirmed by E. Deville, Surveyor General of Dominion Lands on the third day of May, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen; thence westerly along the southern boundary of the said quarter-section a distance of five hundred and fifty feet; thence on a bearing of one hundred and eighty degrees and two minutes a distance of one thousand nine hundred and eighty feet; thence on a bearing of ninety degrees a distance of six hundred and forty-nine feet, more or less, to the intersection with the west boundary of the said section seven in township one, range seventeen east of the principal meridian; thence southerly along the said west boundary and the production thereof a distance of seven hundred and fifty-nine feet to the northwest corner of section six of the said township; thence on a bearing of one hundred and fifty-nine degrees a distance of six thousand five hundred and fifty feet, more or less, to the intersection with the south boundary of the said section six; thence easterly along the said south boundary a distance of two thousand nine hundred and thirty feet, more or less, to the point of commencement; all the said bearings being astronomical and referred to the astronomical meridian through the centre of the said township one, range seventeen, east of the principal meridian; the parcel herein described containing by admeasurement four thousand one hundred and sixty acres, more or less. Provided that there shall be no right to compensation in any way by the Department of Indian Affairs or any person claiming under it for any actual or alleged loss or damage which may be caused by the raising of the mean level of the surface of the lake, as unaffected by wind and storm up to 1002.5 feet above sea level or to any lesser height.

His Excellency the Governor General in Council, on the recommendation of the Minister of the Interior, and under and by virtue of Section 74, Chapter 113, Revised Statutes of Canada, 1927, is pleased to order that the land as described hereunder be and it is hereby withdrawn from the operation of the said Act and set apart for the use of the Indians as St. Peter's Indian Reserve No. 1.

ST. PETERS INDIAN RESERVE No. 1

DESCRIPTION

Being in the province of Manitoba and composed of

Firstly: all that parcel or tract of land in the thirteenth township, in the six range, east of the principal meridian, shown as St. Peter's Indian Reserve upon a map or plan of survey of the said township, signed at Ottawa, on the 2nd day of December, A.D. 1902, by Edouard Deville, Surveyor

General of Dominion Lands, and of record in the Department of Interior;

Secondly: all that parcel or tract of land in the fourteenth township, in the said sixth range, east of the principal meridian, shown as Indian Reserve upon a map or plan of survey of the latter mentioned township, approved and confirmed at Ottawa, on the 14th day of February, A.D. 1873, by John Stoughton Dennis, Surveyor General of Dominion Lands, and of record in the Department of the Interior;

Thirdly: all that parcel or tract of land in the fifteenth township, in the said sixth range, east of the principal meridian, lying to the south of the southern limit of the surveyed road allowance along the south boundary of section thirty and a portion of the south boundary of section twenty-nine, both of the last mentioned township, as shown upon a map or plan of survey of the last mentioned township, signed at Ottawa, on the 23rd day of December, A.D. 1800, by Edouard Deville, Surveyor General of Dominion Lands, and of record in the Department of the Interior;

Fourthly: all that parcel or tract of land in the thirteenth township, in the fifth range, east of the principal meridian, shown as Indian Reserve upon a map or plan of survey of the last mentioned township, approved and confirmed at Ottawa, on the 18th day of December, A.D. 1800, by Edouard Deville, Surveyor General of Dominion Lands, and of record in the Department of the Interior, excepting and reserving thereout all that portion or parcel of land containing an area of twenty acres, more or less, heretofore granted to William Thomas, his heirs and assigns, by letters patent bearing date the 14th day of November, A.D. 1892;

Fifthly: all that parcel or tract of land in the fourteenth township, in the fifth range, east of the principal meridian, which lies to the east of the eastern limit of the Parish of St. Peter, as the said Eastern limit is shown upon a plan of River Lots in the Parish of St. Peter, signed at Ottawa, on the 1st day of January, A.D. 1875, by John Stoughton Dennis, Surveyor General of Dominion Lands, and of record in the Department of the Interior;

Sixthly: all that parcel or tract of land in the said fourteenth township, in the fifth range, east of the principal meridian, which lies to the west of the western limit of the said Parish of St. Peter, as the said western limit is shown upon the said plan of River Lots in the said Parish, and to the north of the North limit of the surveyed road allowance one and one-half chains in width adjoining the Northern limit of the Parish of St. Clements, as the said road allowance is shown upon a plan of Lots in the "Outer Two Miles" Parishes of St. Andrews and St. Clements, signed at Ottawa, on the 1st day of July, A.D. 1877, by John Stoughton Dennis, Surveyor General of Dominion Lands, and of record in the Department of the Interior, saving and excepting thereout all that portion of section eighteen of the last mentioned township heretofore granted to Antoine Couture, his heirs and assigns, by letters patent bearing date the 10th day of May, A.D. 1922, and containing by admeasurement forty acres, more or less;

Seventhly: all that parcel or tract of land in the fifteenth township, in the fifth range, east of the principal meridian, which lies to the south of the southern limit of the statutory road allowance one and one-half chains in width adjoining the south boundaries of sections twenty-five, twenty-six, twenty-seven, twenty-eight, twenty-nine and thirty of the last mentioned township, and which is not included within the limits of the Parish of St.
